## A LEVEL COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course focuses on speaking, listening, reading and writing skills, students who take the subject must be prepared for a subject that is challenging. Students study a variety of topics, as outlined below and in an increasingly global community, transferable language skills for the future.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENT

Students are expected to have a grade 6 at GCSE in their chosen Language.

## COURSE OUTLINE

### SUBJECT CONTENT AT AS

There are three components of the AS paper:

#### Component 1: Speaking

You are given two pictures which are stimulus cards for wider discussion.

*You have 15 minutes preparation time and are then required to discuss each card for 6-7 minutes.*

*This paper is worth 30% of your overall grade.*

#### Component 2: Listening, Reading and Translation

Section A: Listening,

Section B: Reading

Section C: Translation from English into French/German/Spanish and from French/German/Spanish into English.

*This examination lasts 2 hours and is worth 50% of your overall grade.*



## Progression

A language is often the determining factor in obtaining a range of jobs. Areas such as the import/export market, business, finance, banking, politics, international relations, the Civil Service, engineering, scientific research, teaching and interpreting require sound linguistic ability. Moreover, other areas also acknowledge the more general skills that learning a language provides. Areas such as media, journalism, marketing and human resources particularly look to employ language graduates. Language graduates are one of the fastest groups to find gainful employment once they leave university. ### Component 3: Critical response in writing

You are required to write one essay on either the film you have studied or the book that you have studied. You will only study one of the two in year 12.

*This examination lasts 1 hour and 15 minutes.*

*This paper is worth 20% of your overall grade.*

### SUBJECT CONTENT AT A2

There are three components of the AS paper:

#### Component 1: Speaking

Task 1: a) a 2 minute presentation of your independent research project

b) Discussion on the content of your research project for 9-10 minutes

Task 2: A general discussion based on a stimulus card relating to one of the themes studied during the year. (You have five minutes preparation time and must then discuss for 5-6 minutes.)

*The entire speaking assessment lasts 21-23 minutes.*

*This paper is worth 30% of your overall grade.*

#### Component 2: Listening, Reading and Translation

Section A: Listening, Section B: Reading

Section C: Translation from English into French/German/Spanish and from French/German/Spanish into English.

*This examination lasts 2 hours and thirty minutes and is worth 50% of your overall grade.*

### Component 3: Critical response in writing

You are required to write two essays. One must be on a literary text. The second can be either a film or a second literary text that you have studied from the prescribed list.

*This examination lasts 2 hours.*

*This paper is worth 20% of your overall grade.*

### BESPOKE SPEAKING PRACTICE

In order to really develop fluency, we offer 1:1 sessions to all of our Sixth form students. During these sessions we aim to develop greater confidence in speaking. Not only do we work on exam technique and general conversation but we also explore broader cultural elements of the countries that we are studying. In this way our students quickly become confident fluent conversationalists.

### GLOBAL CITIZENS

We also offer our students a broad range of opportunities to enable them to have a broader and deeper appreciation of the language they are studying. Trips to the British Film Institute, The Cervantes Institute, The Goethe Institute and the Institut Francais are only a small part of what we offer to support the development of our students as global citizens. We also make use of our links to King's College and UCL to further develop language proficiency.

## Routes for Success - Technology, Languages And Communication

The Routes to Success Programme is designed for ALL students in Year 12 at St Angela's Ursuline 6th Form. The Technology, Languages and Communication programme aims to offer students opportunities to work with both industry and universities, opportunities will include links with;

It will, of course, be possible to select a subject/subjects from another route on your timetable. We base our Routes to Success Programme on the university curriculum structure and university links are not exclusive to one route, so can be accessed by all students.
